Highlights of 2013

Paul Harris Fellowship awarded to Joan Stallwood



These Fellowships, named after the founder of Rotary, are awarded in recognition of significant service to the community either at home or overseas. While most are awarded to Rotary members, exceptionally they may be awarded to non-Rotarians. This was the case when Joan Stallwood, a founder of the Romsey Family Support Group was given a fellowship in recognition of her many years of selfless work for the Group. Joan is a dedicated unpaid volunteer, working several days a week, every week. Her clients are parents whose families are at risk and are among the most needy and vulnerable people in Romsey.

The Group offers a crèche facility to under-5s to give parents respite and friend-ship and a chance to share knowledge about the well-being of their children in a supportive environment. Last year the Club helped organise a cookery course for the Family Support Group. In addition to the Fellowship badge and citation, Club President John Gould also presented cheques to Joan, money directly from the Club and from sponsored walkers on the Club's annual Walk the Test Way event.

In December two more Fellowships were awarded by the Club, one to Rotarian Tony Trowsdale for his tireless work for Shelterbox, and the second to Mary Ward one of the mainstays of Romsey Young Carers, a support group for young people who care for siblings and parents.

The Club is a partner with the RDS, the Environment Agency, the Hampshire and IoW Wildlife Trust and Test Valley Borough Council in a long-term project (to which TVBC have allocated £30,000) that aims to restore the section of the Andover to Redbridge Barge Canal that runs through Romsey.

The partnership aims to make the stretch of canal from the Plaza to Fishlake Meadows into a recreational asset for Romsey residents while still retaining and improving its role as a wildlife corridor into the heart of the town. A series of wildlife (flora and fauna) surveys will be carried out over the coming summer before further work next winter. Please contact John Gould if you would like to be involved.

(The canal opened in 1794 carrying coal and fertilisers northwards and agricultural produce southwards. It never made a profit and closed to commercial traffic in 1859 after being bought by the Manchester and Southern Railway. Robert Whitworth Drive in Romsey is named after the man who surveyed the canal route).

The event judges were led by Prof. William Drabkin of Southampton University, a specialist in Classical and Choral music supported by Alison Cameron, an experienced music teacher and Simon Newton a specialist in classical and jazz guitar.


Reminiscences of Romsey

The Rotary Club of Romsey Test is in a partnership with Landford-based charity Dentaid. Following the success of the portable dental chair, developed with funding from the Club, Dentaid have produced a complete dental surgery in a wheelie-bin, the Rotary Dentaid Box. The box contains the dental chair, a solar powered suction unit and light, a sterilizer and a range of consumables and dental tools. On March 25th the President of Rotary in Britain and Ireland, John Minhinnick, visited Dentaid to learn about the Box which, thanks to funding from Rotary Clubs is being used by volunteer dentists in Africa and the Far East.

During the visit, Dentaid Chief Executive Andy Jong was presented with a cheque for £1500, the proceeds of a Race Night run by the Rotary Club of Chandlers Ford and Itchen Valley - sufficient to purchase a complete box. For more information on the Dentaid Box please contact Sandy Dunn our

Waitrose supports Dictionary4Life

Last autumn the Club donated personal copies of the Usbourne Illustrated English Dictionary to the 300 year-4 pupils in the nine primary schools in the SO51 post-

The books were purchased at low cost through Rotary's Dictionary4Life project and were so well received (by both children and their teachers) that the donation will be repeated in Autumn

2013. £160 of the approximately £1000 cost will be met from the Waitrose Community Matters initiative that selected D4L as one of their projects in their Romsey store in February.

Walk the Test Way 2012

For the past 10 years the Club has run this event following the Test Way footpath. Last year, despite the economic downturn that has seen donations to charities fall by on average around 20%, WTTW raised over £45,000.

Notably Tim Abbott walked to support Rotary and the

£2000 he raised was matched by £2000 from his employer, Morgan Stanley.

Since the start our walkers have raised over £330,000 for their chosen charities and 25% of this has funded the charitable activities of the Romsey Test Club. This year Lady Brabourne,
